Memorandum of understanding between EUTERP and IRPA





MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING {"MOU") between

EUTERP Foundation (EUTERP) And International Radiation Protection Association (IRPA)

WHEREAS the aim of EUTERP, as a non-profit organisation, is to encourage and support harmonisation of education and training requirements for RPEs, RPOs and radiation workers, facilitating the mobility of these professionals; to promote the integration of radiation protection education and training systems into general vocational training and education infrastructures; and to act as a central focus for the sharing of information on training events, standards, developments, and all other related information;

WHEREAS the aim of IRPA, as a non-profit organisation, is to promote the worldwide enhancement of professional competence, radiation protection culture, and practice by providing benchmarks of good practice, and encouraging the application of the highest standards of professional conduct, skills, and knowledge for the benefit of individuals and society;

WHEREAS EUTERP and IRPA, believe that whilst each has its specific contributions to education and training in radiation protection, collaboration between the two organisations will contribute to the overall joint goal of enhancement of professional competence in radiation protection;

NOW, therefore, the two organizations hereby agree as follows:

1. Purpose of this collaboration

- to recognize that both organizations can complement each other in promoting their respective objectives
- to enhance the cooperation between two organisations in the field of radiation protection.

2. Collaborative Activities

The two organisations will:

- organise joint events or sessions at each other's scientific meetings or workshops;
- invite a designated representative of the other organisation to participate in respective general body meetings as non-voting member;
- · explore opportunities for cooperation on projects.

Any collaborative activity as outlined in this article shall be subject to the availability of sufficient

financial and human resources for that purpose, as well as each Party's programme of work, priorities, regulations and policies. Invitation of representatives to meetings shall be at no cost to the inviting organisation unless specifically agreed.

3. Termination

This MOU may be terminated by either Party via written notice to the other Party.
